4. SHIFTWORK presents Shift, Work, Repeat Pop-Up Art Show Mar 4

SHIFTWORK is excited to announce their next 24-hour-long Pop-Up Art Show. The exhibition, *Shift, Work, Repeat*, will open on Friday, March 3 at 7pm in the SHIFTWORK Studio, located at 384 Queen Street (third floor), and will close at 7pm on Saturday, March 4.

Bringing together new artworks by more than a dozen artists, *Shift, Work, Repeat* will present video, performance, drawing, painting, and digital artworks — all organized around the theme of repetitive acts and repeated forms. Leading up to the show, the collective is working with Grid City magazine to launch a weekly series of works-in-progress, titled *Sketch Wall*, which will pair visual artworks with written responses by other artists, using a call-and-response format.

SHIFTWORK was formed in the spring of 2014 to make space for local artists to create in the off hours, between the demands of day jobs or night shifts. Loosely organized around a shared studio space, the Fredericton-based collective meets regularly to discuss current projects, and plan upcoming events.

Past exhibitions organized by the collective have included *Night Shift* at SHIFTWORK studio, and *Nudes* at Connexion ARC, along with a series of performances, zine launches, and print sales organized in collaboration with Flourish Festival and The Shifty Bits Circus.

7. Monday Night Film Series presents Manchester by the Sea (Mar 6 & 12) & A Quiet Passion (Mar 13)

Manchester by the Sea

Casey Affleck (Gone Baby Gone, Good Will Hunting), Michelle Williams (My Week with Marilyn, Take This Waltz), and Kyle Chandler (Carol, Bloodline) star in this critically acclaimed drama from writer-director Kenneth Lonergan (You Can Count on Me, Margaret), about a reclusive handyman whose life is upended after the sudden death of his beloved older brother. With only his third feature in 16 years, Lonergan takes us through a familiar milieu in Manchester by the Sea, but does so in wholly unfamiliar ways.

Lee Chandler (Affleck) is the resident handyman for a small apartment complex in a Boston suburb. He spends his days shovelling snow, fixing leaks, and doing his best to ignore the tenants' small talk. He spends his evenings either alone in his basement apartment or nursing a beer at his local pub, where he'll pick a fight with anyone who throws a glance his way. Yet buried beneath this sadness and isolation is another life.

When he receives the news that his older brother Joe (Chandler) has died of a congenital heart condition and that, to his unpleasant surprise, he's been appointed legal guardian of Joe's teenage son, Patrick (Lucas Hedges), Lee returns to his nearby seaside hometown. Despite the sudden loss of his father, and in stark contrast to his uncle, Patrick is full of life. A popular student, he juggles hockey, band practice, and two girlfriends. As this mismatched pair stumbles through the mundane details of estate planning and the awkward strain of adolescence, Lee is forced to confront his past, revealed seamlessly through flashbacks, and the realities of his present. In *Manchester by the Sea*, Lonergan has created a world so messy that it can only be described as wonderfully human.

Emily Dickinson is an ideal subject for a filmmaker as unremittingly erudite as Terence Davies (*Sunset Song, The Deep Blue Sea*). Now recognized as a genius who committed to paper some of the most important verses in American literature, the 19th Century poet was virtually unknown in her lifetime, with fewer than a dozen of her nearly 1,800 poems published. A recluse who eventually boarded herself up in her bedroom, Dickinson explored her inner self in great detail. And while the internal lives of poets are hard to visualize, her story is as poetic as her work itself.

Dickinson (Cynthia Nixon, James White) led such a deeply introverted existence, and yet it is her encounters with her mother, father, and sister that structure the film. These moments - familiar to all who know the role that families play in Davies' work – are sensitively rendered, but it is the seamless manner in which Dickinson's luminous poetry is integrated that is the central joy of *A Quiet Passion*.

Stunning in its sumptuous photography, the film's beauty is also evident in the respect and love that it brings to its subject. A magician when it comes to understanding the inner workings of the most sensitive of minds, Davies has created an extraordinarily moving account of Emily Dickinson's particular genius.

This year, 30 limited release, independent, foreign, and Canadian films will be shown. Admission is \$7/film, but a yearly film society membership reduces admission cost to \$4/film. 8. The Boat: A Maritime Story about Leaving Home Mar 9-18

Theatre New Brunswick is thrilled to announce the world premiere production of *The Boat*, from the short story by Alistair MacLeod, adapted by New Brunswick playwright Ryan Griffith.

The Boat tells the story of a young man from a Cape Breton fishing family who faces the all too common decision to stay and build a life at home or leave the East Coast in search of new opportunities. "A Maritime story about leaving home", this beautifully touching play follows a Maritime family as they navigate their children growing up. The Boat will receive a two week production run at Theatre New Brunswick's Open Space Theatre (March 9-18) before entering a three week run at Halifax's Neptune Theatre and a full week of touring to New Brunswick communities.

This play also marks the second in the company's commitment to the development and production of new work by New Brunswick playwright Ryan Griffith following last season's technology based, site specific work, *Returning Fire*, presented as part of Fredericton's 2016 FROSTival celebrations.

For this production, Theatre New Brunswick welcomes an impressive group of professional actors and designers from across the country to bring Griffith's work to the stage, including Jon de Leon who has worked on some of the country's most celebrated stages and will be featured in the upcoming Matt Damon comedy *Downsizing*; Stephanie MacDonald, who appeared last season in Mulgrave Road's production of *Watching Glory Die*; and New Brunswick born actor Graham Percy who last joined TNB for the 2015 staged reading of David Adams Richards' *Beaverbrook*. Ron Kennel, who plays the son in the story, also boasts an impressive career on stage and screen, appearing alongside *Game of Thrones'* Kit Harington in the 2014 action/drama, *Pompeii*.

The Stanfields are a five-piece rock/roots band based in Halifax NS, Canada. They play what they want, sing what they feel, and leave nothing on the table. The Stanfields released their debut album, *Vanguard of the Young & Reckless*, in 2010 and followed up with *Death & Taxes* in 2012. A third album, *For King and Country* was released on October 15, 2013. The album contained 10 new songs written, performed and recorded completely acoustically. The band's fourth full-length record, *Modem Operandi*, was released on September 18, 2015.

In 2016 Modem Operandi was nominated for ECMA Rock Recording of the Year and saw the band tour throughout Germany. The Stanfields are currently on tour throughout Europe and Germany and will find themselves back in Canada just in time for a spring tour in March.

The UNB Art Centre is pleased to announce the opening of two new exhibitions featuring the work of talented New Brunswick Artists. New Brunswick Art Bank – Acquisitions 2015-16 and Mary White – Thinking is FORM open on Friday, March 10, with an opening reception from 5 to 7pm, and run through March 31, 2017.

In the East Gallery, some familiar artists return to the UNB Art Centre with works from *New Brunswick Art Bank – Acquisitions 2015-16*. Several of the artists featured in this show, including Paul Mathieson, Ann Manuel, and Paul Griffin have exhibited works at the UNB Art Centre in the past. In this exhibition, their work is featured along with 13 other New Brunswick artists. 12. Symphony New Brunswick begins Sesquicentennial Celebrations with New Commission Mar 14

As part of Symphony New Brunswick's New Brunswick on Show concert from March 13-15, Christine Donkin's new work Hopewell Cape will be performed by SNB musicians as part of a very exciting concert. In addition to playing Hopewell Cape, Symphony New Brunswick will present internationally-renowned horn player Ulises Aragon, from Dieppe, and the works of well-known composer Michael Miller of Fredericton.

Maestro Michael Newnham will lead the Symphony in a concert that can be described as idyllic and pastoral. This lyrical and accessible concert will charm audiences and help us all through the last days of winter. Also on the program will be the delightful *Siegfried's Idyll*, written by Richard Wagner as a birthday present to his second wife, Cosima, after the birth of their son Siegfried in 1869, in addition to works for a smaller orchestra by Walton, Larsson, and Schumann. Rounding out the evening,

Michael Miller's Horn composition reminds us of family ties that are so important to us in New Brunswick. Ulises Aragon was the First Horn in the Simon Bolivar Symphony Orchestra, in Caracas, Venezuela, from 1989 to 2012 and currently serves as resident teacher at the International Horn Festival in Manizales, Colombia, held annually since 2006, in addition to his position as Principal Horn of Symphony New Brunswick.

Michael Miller, a composer, pianist, and retired professor of music, has degrees from New York University, and the Eastman School of Music at the University of Rochester, NY. He has taught at New York University, Vassar College, and Mount Allison University in Sackville, NB, where he is Professor Emeritus.

Introduction to Weaving: Rigid Heddle Basics Workshop Saturday, March 18 and 25, 9am – 4pm Anna Mathis (6 seats)

Have you ever wanted to learn how to weave? In this two-day workshop you we will be experiencing this historic craft first hand by designing, setting up a rigid heddle loom and creating a personalized hand woven scarf! Looms and tools will be provided

for this weaving introduction. Professional textiles artist Anna Mathis will wow you with her skills, creativity and attention to detail. Come inside and beat the winter blues with this two-day

workshop! Material cost \$45.

Bracelet Workshop

Saturday, March 4, 9am – 4pm Audrée H-St- Amour (8 seats)

In this class, students will create a bracelet using jump rings connecting one after another. You will learn how to make a jump ring, by learning how to cut, and how to assemble this unique chainmail bracelet. Your project uses minimal tools and equipment, does not require soldering and can easily be reproduced at home! If you want to get a taste of a genuine jewellery studio but can only commit to a small amount of time then you need to sign up for this course fast! Material cost is \$30-\$60 (Depending on size and design of individual projects)
