## 2. Anna Cameron's *Wildflower* & Julie Ann Hughes' *Below the Surface* open at Gallery 78 May 19

Anna Cameron's painting is inspired by the changing landscape - both the long term geological shifts, and the more immediate seasonal changes. Wildflowers randomly and freely transform the land with colour and texture as they are left to bloom and seed. Cameron also explores colour and texture and a certain randomness of composition in her paintings, achieving a feeling of open space. Sparrows are the observers who quietly watch the changes taking place from their higher vantage point. Her latest exhibition is called *Wildflower*.

Julie Ann Hughes is a 2015 award-winning graduate of the Jewellery/Metal Arts Program of the New Brunswick College of Craft and Design. Since graduation she has been diligently working as a goldsmith/silversmith on her native Prince Edward Island. The UNB Art Centre is pleased to announce the opening of *Standardizing Nature* on May 19, 2017 by Toronto-based artist Susana Reisman. Ms. Reisman will be present at the opening to give a walking tour of the exhibit.

Born in Caracas, Venezuela, Susana Reisman received her BA in Economics from Wellesley College in Boston in 1999 and then her MFA in Photography at the Rochester Institute of Technology in 2005. She has exhibited extensively across Canada and in the United States and has completed several international residencies. She is currently based in Toronto where she runs Circuit Gallery, specializing in contemporary photography.

Reisman's dual interest in art and economics coalesces in this exhibition. Through photography and sculpture, *Standardizing Nature* examines the lumber industry and the process by which forests are transformed into commodities. *Standardizing Nature* allows us to reflect on trees as living nature and reminds us of the origin of the ubiquitous sheet of plywood or two by four plank.

## 15. Three New Brunswick Artists Receive Sheila Mackay Advanced Studies Scholarships

The Sheila Hugh Mackay Foundation is delighted to award three Advanced Studies Scholarships for the 2017 academic year. Patrick Allaby, Jessica Arseneau, and Elizabeth Grant will each receive the \$5,000 scholarship to support post-secondary studies.

**Patrick Allaby**, a 2015 graduate of Mount Allison University, will enter the University of Waterloo to pursue a Masters of Fine Arts. His distinctive work as a cartoonist and illustrator impressed the jury as rich in creative promise. **Jessica Arseneau** of Tilly Road is pursuing a Master's of Fine Art in Leipzig, Germany, concentrating in performance art. The jury characterized her work as a sustained conceptual and formal investigation of contemporary art. **Elizabeth Grant** of Saint John will be working towards a Masters of Arts in Art Business at the Sotheby's Institute of Art in New York. The jury noted that Ms. Grant is a gifted painter and critical writer with a deep and thoughtful commitment to art and visual culture. Her commitment to critical discourse answers a recognised need for professional growth and development across the sector.

The Sheila Hugh Mackay Advanced Studies Scholarship was established by the Foundation's Board of Directors after Ms. Mackay's death to honour her life-time commitment to the encouragement of excellence in the visual arts. These scholarships support New Brunswick residents entering a recognized graduate or doctoral program in either studio based work or in academic studies in Art History, Art Education or Art Gallery and Museum Studies. They are given on the recommendation of an independent jury of art professionals.

- **Trapunto by Machine**

- Learn the modern way to make the classic quilt. Using machine quilting and modern techniques, produce a beautiful trapunto block. Methods to further enhance trapunto by using bobbin work will be demonstrated. Design considerations enabling the student to choose their own patterns will be discussed.

- **Sunday May 28**

- **Thread Painting**

- Learn the basics of free motion embroidery using your regular sewing machine. Complete a sampler as you learn to make grasses, leaves, flowers, weeds, trees, etc. You can spend the entire day perfecting your skills or start a simple landscape. Information on design will also be discussed.

- **Wednesday, May 31**

- **Painting Backgrounds for Quilts or Embroideries**

- Learn to paint using Pebeo setacolor fabric paints on cotton or embroidery fabrics. Create your own fabric for a special landscape, shaded fabric for a flower you wish to appliqué, yardage for a special sky or backgrounds for embroidery. You will learn how to mix colours and apply the paints. Special effects techniques, such as sun printing and using salt, will also be explored.
