Guy David McDonald, from Kenora, Ontario, grew up in a musical family and began playing guitar at the age of 10. By 13, his interest had moved to the bass guitar, playing in several punk and metal bands throughout the years. Since relocating to Vancouver in 2010, Guy David has been working to increase the amount of time spent on the road touring the continent with his latest project Skeeter and the Deets, showcases many classic country covers as well as a growing list of originals.

Although guitarist Kris Schulz can't remember the first time he picked up a guitar, he vividly recalls the days when his obsession with instrument at 14 consumed him as he dreamt of making music both his life and his living. More than 25 years later, he's come full-circle, back to the passion and intensity that drove him when he used to play until his hands felt like they were about to fall off, his fingers calloused and bleeding. His debut solo release, *While the City Sleeps*, was released in 2016 and was recorded by legendary guitarist Antoine Dufour.

This Spring you can catch an acoustic performance of North Shore as vocalist and guitarist Jordan McDonald will be joining the *Way They Used To Do'er Tour* across Canada. Following a huge 2015 that included releasing a full-length album, *Moments*, and a Canadian tour culminating in opening for Daughtry at Harbourfest Music Festival, North Shore recorded their highly anticipated third release to date, 2016's *Chasing Fireworks*. Working towards the future, North Shore continues to sell-out venues in their hometown and surrounding areas while working on their next full-length album to be released in late 2017.

Luke Michielsen is a songwriter and guitarist from Kitchener, Ontario. Over the past decade, he has recorded and released over 50 original songs. Methodically crafted guitar parts and subtle poetic lyrics are the mainstays of his writing style. Luke has played several hundred shows across Canada over the last decade. He has also entertained audiences abroad in the USA, Europe and South Korea. His comedic sense between songs is a hallmark of his live performance.

Phil is a contemporary singer/songwriter who has earned excellent reviews from the national press, with his thought provoking song writing and energetic live performances drawing comparisons to Neil Finn, Glenn Tilbrook, and Ben Folds. During his live shows, he makes a real connection with the crowd, whether it's handing out dozens of eggshakers, or passing around his "doodle book" for the audience to draw in. Every now and then you'll catch him unplugging his guitar and shunning the stage to stand right in among the captivated audience.

2016 is an exciting prospect that sees Phil turning his back on his life in executive management, and plunging head first into a fully professional music career with the help of a brand new album, *Things I'll Never Say*. Phil is also heavily involved with the Village Pump Folk Festival, having stage managed the Village Pump Stage since 2012.

Tom Savage is what one might refer to as a triple-threat: one part truth-telling troubadour, one part death-defying guitar-slinger, and one part Country Blues howler. Each facet of his formidable on-stage persona carefully crafted over a 20+ year devotion to the composition and performance of song. Tom is a true believer; a disciple of melody and harmony and tempo and timbre; an evangelist preaching to anyone who will listen of the healing and meditative powers of music. Pouring his heart out of his throat every night, while simultaneously shredding his fingertips in his relentless assault on the beat-up 1966 Guild acoustic he adores.

Tom Savage's music comes from places occupied by Townes Van Zandt and Bruce Springsteen, but also lurking in the shadows of influence are Jimi Hendrix and Jimmy Page in one corner, and Wes Montgomery and Freddie Robinson in another. You have no idea what flavour the combination will result in. This is the time when many musical seeds were planted in Tom's psyche, thus the beginning of a lifelong journey. Where does he stand today? A writer of Country and Folksongs, sung in a weathered, emotive voice with a hint of a Bluesman's growl, accompanied by fiery and fast rock n roll guitar licks (these days Savage opts for the acoustic guitar, occasionally mandolin, rather than reaching for the electric). Tom Savage is not your average folksinger.

- Look at how artists have portrayed Canada over 150 years.
- Create a drama of Champlain, scurvy, St. Croix Island and the Order of Good Cheer. Film it!
- Start with Bliss Carman's poetry and paint his visual images.
- What works for you? Your school? Your students? Your artistic impulses?

Students in ten schools will be able to delve into some facet of 150 years of Canada, in a way appropriate to their age and the skills and interests of the artists and teachers who apply.
