This year's performances will kick off with a remount of the company's hit 2017 production of *The Comedy of Errors*. A high-spirited, farcical comedy, the play depicts the chaos that results when two pairs of long-lost identical twins unknowingly find themselves in the same city, causing cases of mistaken identity to spiral out of control.

Running in tandem will be Shakespeare's fairy tale-like romance *Cymbeline*, the story of a princess separated from her true love by the machinations of her evil step-mother and the scheming of a pair of buffoonish villains. Inspired by the movie *The Princess Bride* and staged in the company's trademark promenade style, which sees the audience immersed in the action and following scenes between different locations in the park, *Cymbeline* will thrill with music, comedy, surprising twists and turns, and stirring battle scenes.

Through hands-on learning you will be taught how to blend pre-dyed wools to mix your own colours, as well as discover an abundance of techniques (2D & 3D) used to create stunning textures using cloth, an assortment fibres, yarns, and physical manipulation. Auditions | Call for Artist Submissions & Awards

1. The Fredericton Arts Alliance Looking for Projects in Area Schools

Teachers or artists can propose programs that would bring an artist to work in a school with a class of students for an extended period. Normally the projects would run from 15 to 25 hours. Artists can be from any discipline - visual art, music, writing, drama or more. The artists will be paid \$600 per project. The FAA will also cover the cost of approved materials.

Previous projects have included puppetry, mural painting, musical theatre, art history, sculpture, an exploration of the use of wool through the years, and more. The successful applications will be for programs to run in the fall.
