1. 2024 Fredericton Music Festival is April 15 - 25

The 77th annual Fredericton Music Festival will continue until April 25. Once again, residents of the capital region will have an opportunity to hear the musical talents from within their own community performing in seven venues across the city. Highly qualified professionals have been selected from Atlantic Canada and beyond to adjudicate the wide variety of classes in choir, band, piano, strings, brass, voice, woodwinds, musical theatre, and for the first time, indigenous music.

As in past years, some of these talented musicians may move on to represent the community at the Provincial competition. Festival programs are available at Tony's Music Box, and at all venues during the festival for \$10. The cost to attend the festival is \$2 per session and students are free. The Hello Crows were formed in 2022, when songwriters and storytellers Judie Acquin, Dylan Ward, Mattie Comeau, and Quinn Bonnell first appeared together at a Wabanaki songwriters' circle. Sharing the stage, their chemistry became obvious; their combined voices amplified their powerful messages of lessons from the past, anthems for the present, and hope in the future. While the group, focuses on the indigenous cultures, values and traditions, it also presents the perspectives of indigenous women and LQBTQIA2+ communities.

The 23rd series of the Fredericton Arts Alliance's Artists in Residence will return to the Casemates in the historic Garrison District. The week-long residences will run from June 24 to September 1, with the final residency running for eight days.

Two artists at a time will work in the Casemate studio with the opportunity to bounce ideas off each other, share insights, learn new approaches, broaden horizons and expand art practices. After last year's success, we are retaining the theme of "Collaboration" in the hope artists from different media and approaches will work together to create something new. If two artists are interested in exploring collaboration, they should submit a joint application. Otherwise the scheduling committee will do its best to arrange dates that suit the artists so that new friendships (and perhaps collaborations) will ensue.

We seek emerging and experienced artists working in any media, including architecture, performance, sculpture, music, dance, electronic media, literary arts, visual art, fibre arts and fine craft. We welcome artists from diverse cultural backgrounds. We encourage artists to use their own social media to promote their time in the Casemate, and the Fredericton Arts Alliance will use our social media as well to promote the program.

In their applications, artists should indicate how they plan to approach the theme. Applications will be reviewed by an independent jury who will select the successful artists, who will receive a \$500 honorarium. The Fredericton Arts Alliance will also try to mount an exhibition of work produced over the summer at the Charlotte Street Arts Centre in fall 2024. Where appropriate, participants will be invited to designate a piece for this exhibition.

The first winner, in 2023, was David Steeves, music teacher at Devon Middle School. Anyone – a colleague, student, parent, school administrator, or community member – familiar with the nominee's teaching may make a nomination.

- The nominee should be committed to using the arts in education in our public schools.

The award includes:

- Two complimentary tickets to the FAA Gala, For Arts Sake, held in October 2024, for both the recipient and their nominator.
- Recognition of the recipient at the FAA Gala.

- The nominee should provide students of all backgrounds and skills with an active opportunity to learn, experience, participate in and appreciate the arts.
- The nominee should be a strong advocate for preserving arts education in the public school classroom
- A one year membership in the FAA
- A framed original artwork by George Strunz
- A \$200 gift certificate for art-related materials.
