The UNB Art Centre presents its first exhibition of 2021 online with *Cut.Paste.Resist.Redux* at <https://www.unb.ca/cel/enrichment/art-centre/online-exhibits/index.html>. This exhibition reconfigures works sent in for a pop-up exhibition called *Cut/Paste/Resist*, co-created by UNB's 2020 Writer-in-Residence R.M. Vaughan and Dr. Ken Moffatt, the Jack Layton Chair in Social Work at Ryerson University.

As part of this tribute, The UNB Art Centre in collaboration with Dr. Ken Moffatt has invited friends of R.M. Vaughan to select a passage from one of his many works of poetry, prose and criticism. These readings will be released on social media throughout the month of January as a way to honour R.M. Vaughan's memory and to mark the tremendous loss to the cultural community of this gifted Canadian artist.

## 4. Shivering Songs Kick-Off (Jan. 20) plus Jeremy Dutcher (Jan. 22) & Grand Theft Bus (Jan. 23) at Playhouse

- **January 20 at 7:30pm: Kick Off**  
Shivering Songs has shared the initial details of its eleventh anniversary edition, announcing plans to present a virtual series of events throughout the winter months of 2021. Live presentations would feature reduced capacity venues and stringent safety protocols, in cooperation with the New Brunswick Department of Public Safety. Organizers are working with both existing venues and new spaces, to create a socially distanced concert experience that ensures a safe, comfortable environment for all artists, patrons, volunteers, and support staff.
- **January 22 at 7:30pm: Jeremy Dutcher**  
Performer, composer, activist, musicologist — these roles are all infused into Jeremy Dutcher's art and way of life. His music, too, transcends boundaries: unapologetically playful in its incorporation of classical influences, full of reverence for the traditional songs of his home, and teeming with the urgency of modern-day struggles of resistance.
- **January 23 at 7:30pm: Grand Theft Bus**  
Grand Theft Bus have been making their breed of eclectic pop music since the dawn of the millennium. Their three albums, *Birth of Confusion* (2002), *Flies in the No-Fly* (2005), and *Made Upwards* (2008), are all incredibly different records in feel and tone but are similar in that each possesses a great mix of styles and captures a restless band following their muse wherever it leads them. Songs can vary from basic guitar pop to dark synthesizer-driven anthems to instrumental pieces with electronic flourishes.

The 2021 Fredericton Music Festival will take place virtually in April 2021, for this year only. Registration is now open for Solo Classes and Small Group Classes. Large Group, Sight Reading, and Quick Study classes will not be offered in 2021.

### 4. New 2021 Jane LeBlanc Music Award

This in-kind award is valued at \$2,500. - Send two short paragraphs talking about your creative hopes and dreams, what your music means to you, and what you want to do career-wise. Please tell us something about your background in music up to this point.

**Eligibility:** This in-kind award is for any composer-singer or composer-singer who is also a musician who has never had the opportunity to work with a studio and release their original work professionally through online music distribution platforms.

- Assistance with mastering and distribution costs;
- 1 to 2 session musicians, if needed, for the professional studio recording;
