1. Will Anyone Actually See This? Photography Exhibit, Apr. 9-May 6, Charlotte Street Arts Centre

April 15 is Bliss Carman's 160th birthday, and to celebrate this occasion The Calithumpians will host a "Blissful Birthday Bash" at Forest Hill Cemetery. The public is cordially invited to attend; masks and social distancing will be required. There is plenty of parking available by the office on-site. The gathering will include poetry and song plus a short tour of the hillside cemetery.

Forest Hill Cemetery is the last resting place of the three poets who made Fredricton famous as "The Poets Corner of Canada" in the 1940s. These poets include Bliss Carman, Sir Charles GD Roberts and Francis Sherman; all Fredericton born and educated at University of New Brunswick. UNB's long-time Writer-in-Residence, Alden Nowlan is also buried there and will be featured on the tour as well. Back to top.

Symphony New Brunswick core members, the Saint John String Quartet, Andrew Miller, and Joel Cormier will join forces to create an eclectic concert of chamber music. The "not so" *Simple Symphony* by Benjamin Brittain will examine how string players can be boisterous, playful, sentimental, and frolicsome. And finally all together the sextet will perform Keith Bissell's work "How the loon got its necklace" based on the British Columbia First Nations Salish's legend.

Frederictonian, Stanton Friedman was internationally recognized as the leading authority on UFOs, alien abductions and the Roswell incident. He was inducted into the UFO Hall of Fame in Roswell, New Mexico, and his work was celebrated by the City of Fredericton when it declared August 27, 2007, Stanton Friedman Day. Friedman's extensive archive forms the basis of the Fredericton Region Museum's upcoming Stanton Friedman Exhibit in summer 2021.

1. Call for Applications: Fredericton Arts Alliance Summer 2021 Artists in Residence

Theme: Looking Inward/Looking Outward

Deadline: Applications must be received no later than 4pm on Friday, May 21, 2021

The Fredericton Arts Alliance invites applications for our 20th Artist in Residence Summer Series. Accepted artists receive a \$450 honorarium. We seek emerging and experienced artists working in any media, including: architecture, performance, sculpture, music, dance, electronic media, literary arts, visual art, fibre arts, and fine craft. We encourage artists from diverse cultural backgrounds.

As with last year, these residencies will be largely virtual, with artists using their own social media and working with the FAA's social media platforms to showcase their work and process to a wider public. In addition, we ask each participating artist to organize a "pop-up" event as part of their residency. These could be in the form of a poetry reading in front of City Hall, an art display on the Green, a dance lesson at Carleton Park, a demonstration of techniques used during the residency, a musical performance in Odell Park, or something completely different that is appropriate to the artist and the media involved.

The pop-up could be during the week of the residency, or in days following it, with weather and COVID restrictions being limiting factors. If a residency occurred during tight COVID controls or during a week of unremitting rain, the pop-up could be arranged later when the forces affecting the virus and the skies are more amenable.

This summer our theme will be *Looking Inward/Looking Outward*. We invite artists to reflect on this theme as they work. As different artists in varied media focus their creative energies on this theme, we hope to engender discussion among the artists and members of the public, both here and afar.

The residences, one at a time, will run from June 20 to September 11, 2021. Each residency lasts for one week. Interested artists should say how they intend to approach the theme in their written application and what they plan by way of a "pop-up".
