Audience members will either sit in the circle with us or will view from an adjacent seating area. 9. Bard in the Barracks presents *The Tempest* in the Fredericton Botanic Garden, Jun. 24 – Jul. 4

The Tempest is a timeless tale that conjures high drama, low comedy, and first love. Twelve years ago the powerful sorcerer Prospero was overthrown as ruler of Milan and exiled to a barren planet. Now Prospero, with the aid of her trusty cyborg companion Ariel, has raised an interstellar storm that has brought a spaceship carrying all those who conspired against her to the planet. With her enemies at her mercy, will Prospero choose the path of vengeance or forgiveness?

Bard in the Barracks' *The Tempest* faithfully transports Shakespeare's Renaissance tale of exploration and discovery from the distant past to the distant future, in a production that pays loving homage to early science fiction cinema and TV series of the 1950s-60s. Audiences will be taken on a sunset walking tour of the beautiful Fredericton Botanic Garden while the action of *The Tempest* unfolds all around them, replete with magic and wonders both theatrical and natural.

Performance dates: June 24 through July 4, except no show on Wednesday, June 30. All performances begin at 8pm, but patrons should arrive at the Prospect Street entrance of the Botanic Garden by 7:40pm to allow time to make it to the play's starting point and check in at our ticket desk. Fredericton's Canada Day Committee is finalizing plans for the City to celebrate our nation's 153rd birthday; however, the changing face of the COVID-19 pandemic is certainly making that a challenge. As well, the committee and the City of Fredericton is working with the Province of New Brunswick to determine if the annual Canada Day fireworks ceremony can take place and hopes to have an update soon. 1. TNB Musical Theatre Advanced Audition Technique Workshop with Tony LePage & Courtney Hammond

Beginning in late June, the TNB Theatre School will be hosting a four-part workshop led by two experts in the field: Tony LePage and Courtney Hammond, who will take participants behind-the-scenes to offer an inside look at what is expected from both sides of the audition process.

LePage is a Broadway performer known for his roles in *Rock of Ages* and *Come From Away*. Originally from Fredericton, he makes time whenever possible to return to his hometown and share his experience with both his peers and next generation performers. Hammond, a New York City-based casting director, will join LePage for this one of a kind workshop experience. Courtney is a passionate coach and teacher, regularly invited to teach throughout New York City and around the United States at colleges and universities.

The Musical Theatre Advanced Audition Technique Workshop series is open to all performers aged 15 and up and will take place at the Theatre School on Monday evenings from June 21 to July 12. Students will learn the ins and outs of making a solid impression at a first audition, followed by scene work, song work and final call-back performances. - 1-to-2 session musicians, if needed, for the professional studio recording.

- One-on-one professional development session with Kate Butler of She Said Feck! Records and Colin Fowlie of Colin Fowlie Music.

The Career Development program is designed to recognize and encourage arts professionals who have demonstrated exceptional artistic talent and potential, and who are pursuing a career in the arts. The program is divided in four components:

- **The Arts by Invitation** component is for assistance to present work by invitation in established arts events.
- **The Artist in Residence** component is for assistance for participation in residency opportunities of three (3) months and less. The artists in residence are to contribute to the promotion and understanding of the arts by means of the artists' contact with the clientele of the establishments.
- **The Professional Development** component is for assistance for professional development scholarships for studies and mentorships.
- **The Professionalization and Promotion** component is designed to assist artists to produce tools related to the promotion of the artist's work and career with a view to broadening the dissemination network for their work and diversifying their sources for funding.

Students planning to pursue studies in a recognized program in the performing arts are invited to apply for the Council of the Arts Fredericton Performing Arts Scholarship. The annual award is valued at \$5,000. It is intended for residents of the greater Fredericton area. The course of study can take place at any institution recognized by the Canada Revenue Agency and must involve performance or production. Students at secondary, post-secondary and graduate levels are eligible.

Information and application guidelines are available through the Fredericton Community Foundation at www.fredfdn.ca. **Applications must be received on or before July 31, 2021.** The recipient will be determined by a three-member selection committee.

From 1978 until 2006, Council of the Arts Fredericton presented quality performances to Fredericton audiences through its ONSTAGE and KIDSTAGE programs, and encouraged young people in their study of the performing arts through awards and scholarships. The Performing Arts Scholarship was created in 2007 with funds from the Council that are managed through a designated fund agreement with the Fredericton Community Foundation. [Back to top.](#)
