This show, created and performed by Spirit Project artists with and without intellectual disabilities, celebrates the unique gifts of each individual, highlights diverse artistic voices and shares the joys of living in an inclusive society.

Since May 2019, Solo Chicken and partners have run The Spirit Project, a series of mixed ability art-based workshops where folks of all abilities, including adults with intellectual disabilities, come together in community to create. Led by the desire to share the gifts of our artists and to demonstrate the beauty of inclusion we decided this show would be an invitation to join our circle and share in our artistic practice.

*WE ARE LUMINOUS* is a walk-through a day at The Spirit Project, featuring our warm-up, meditation, games and special performances of our Spirit Project song and poem. The performance will conclude with an offering of food created by HUB in the Kitchen, led by Chef Yves. Audience members will either sit in the circle with us or will view from an adjacent seating area. The performances are relaxed, which means lights are on, noise is moderated, and all are welcome to participate and be in the space in any way.

### 4. Bard in the Barracks presents *The Tempest* in the Fredericton Botanic Garden, Jun. 24 – Jul. 4 at 8pm

Bard in the Barracks is bringing live outdoor theatre back to Fredericton this summer, with a science fiction-inspired production of Shakespeare's *The Tempest* set to run at 8pm nightly, except no show on June 3, in a new location: the Fredericton Botanic Garden.

A tale of adventure, revenge, romance, and reunion that had its origins in the tales of discovery that early explorers were bringing back to Renaissance England from the New World, *The Tempest* centres around Prospero, a sorcerer/scholar who has been usurped as the ruler of Milan and sent into exile on a distant island. When a storm causes a ship piloted by her enemies to crash ashore, her opportunity to gain revenge is suddenly at hand.

Inspired by science fiction movies and TV series of the 1950s and 60s, Bard in the Barracks' production will see the island as a strange planet populated by aliens and visited by marooned space travellers, with the Fredericton Botanic Garden offering a verdant and rugged backdrop as the enchanted isle of the play's setting. Like past Bard in the Barracks productions, *The Tempest* will be staged promenade-style, with the audience moving between locations to watch the play's different scenes, with physical distancing and limits on audience size observed to meet COVID-19 restrictions.

## 13. An Open Letter from Downtown Fredericton Businesses - RE: Fredericton's Performing Arts Centre

As business owners and operators in downtown Fredericton, we are impacted by the health and vitality of our City's central business district and the regional economy. The Fredericton Playhouse plays a major role in not only contributing to the cultural life available to residents of our community, but also in bringing people into the downtown and making Fredericton a competitive destination for skilled workers and business investment. The Playhouse is beyond its useful life and its design and condition make its refurbishment unfeasible. We cannot lose this valuable community asset. It must be replaced.

Thankfully, the leadership at the Fredericton Playhouse and the City of Fredericton have a bold plan to build a new performing arts centre to replace the Playhouse. We are fully supportive of this plan to invest in cultural infrastructure in our downtown – a plan which will build on the Playhouse's record of success and take it to a new level, further animating our downtown and providing important cultural opportunities for our region.

The City of Fredericton has shown leadership. They have identified this project as its top priority for new infrastructure and have committed \$14 million to its construction. Further, they have begun the process of designing the new facility. Now is the time for the federal and provincial governments to step up and confirm their financial commitment. We urge you and our other elected officials to get to work to secure the funding required to build a new performing arts centre to replace the failing Playhouse facility.

As we embark on our collective recovery from the impact of COVID-19 on our economy, this project is a welcome investment. We expect all levels of government to work in partnership with each other and the community to address this urgent priority for our downtown businesses.

The Jane LeBlanc Legacy Fund was created in memory of Jane LeBlanc. The fund is in place to assist emerging New Brunswick resident filmmakers, writers, actors, visual artists, singers, and musicians. Jane was a multidisciplinary artist and adventurer who traveled the world at a young age. She was a writer, photographer, singer, musician, videographer, and visual artist.

#### **Jane LeBlanc Music Award - Deadline: June 25, 2021**

This in-kind award is valued at \$5,000. If the music jury selects you, you will receive:

- Full assistance with recording and mastering (Eastern Hive Studio) and marketing and distribution costs (Cat LeBlanc Music).
- 1-to-2 session musicians, if needed, for the professional studio recording.
- One-year membership with the NB Film Co-op, Music•Musique NB, and the Writers' Federation of New Brunswick.
- One-on-one professional development session with Kate Butler of She Said Feck! Records and Colin Fowlie of Colin Fowlie Music.
- One-on-one consultation with iconic singer/songwriter Dan Hill (was just inducted into the Canadian Songwriters Hall of Fame).
- Assistance with album art and logo brand creation (Cat LeBlanc and Colin Fowlie Music).
- Assistance with production of a music video (KenLar Productions).

We are seeking contributors for CreatedHere Magazine Issue 18: *Ode to Studios*, launching December 2021. From the rolling tides of Fundy to the bustling historic splendour of Saint John, to an abundance of tight-knit, water-laced communities, South NB is an artistic adventurer's dream. The Career Development program is designed to recognize and encourage arts professionals who have demonstrated exceptional artistic talent and potential, and who are pursuing a career in the arts. The program is divided in four components:

- **The Arts by Invitation** component is for assistance to present work by invitation in established arts events.
- **The Artist in Residence** component is for assistance for participation in residency opportunities of three (3) months and less. The artists in residence are to contribute to the promotion and understanding of the arts by means of the artists' contact with the clientele of the establishments.
- **The Professional Development** component is for assistance for professional development scholarships for studies and mentorships.
- **The Professionalization and Promotion** component is designed to assist artists to produce tools related to the promotion of the artist's work and career with a view to broadening the dissemination network for their work and diversifying their sources for funding.
