1. Fredericton Arts Alliance Summer Residencies present Cheryl Lavigne from Jul. 18-24

Cheryl Lavigne will be painting in different locations in the Fredericton area during her residency, and will be “connecting to people who are connecting to their environment.” She will create a single finished piece on each outing, using mixed media with a focus on painting and sketching. Weather permitting, the pieces will be done outdoors. Lavigne will be painting portraits and scenes which will include other people within various natural settings around the city. Her planned painting locations will be announced in advance, to encourage art lovers to seek her out and participate in her project.

Lavigne’s work centers on nature and how people interact with it. She will respond to the theme of “Looking Inward, Looking Outward” by looking into her personal growth and healing by connecting to her environment and those who share it. Her paintings and drawings will capture the experiences of community members sharing the natural environment. Lavigne is a mixed-media artist, who is drawn to nature and organic forms. She is interested in arts education, wellness, and ecology. Her artwork often focuses on visual details of the forest floor.

3. City of Fredericton Summer Artist in Residence: Gary Crosby & Somayeh (Somi) Soltanizadeh Jul. 12 – 23

Find woodcarver Gary Crosby at Killarney Lake Park and textile designer Somayeh (Somi) Soltanizadeh in the Fredericton Botanic Garden at Odell Park. Visitors can see artists in person while abiding by public health guidelines. For daily updates and weekly events, follow the artists’ social media linked through our website.

Gary Crosby began exploring woodworking when he was deployed with the Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) to West Germany in 1984. He studied the craft with local carvers and would continue to do so around the world for over 30 years afterwards. Since departing from the CAF, Gary designs and wood-carves full time. Areas he explores in his art include climate change, wildlife, ecological diversity, architectural carvings, garden and functional art, as well as epoxy and carving art. During the residency, Gary will explore the connection between humans and our ecosystems with white cedar post carvings, and he will host live-streams online.

Somayeh (Somi) Soltanizadeh is a textile artist originally from Isfahan, Iran, who works with knitting, crocheting, embroidery, beadwork, and fashion design. Since coming to Canada, Somayeh has further developed her craft in fashion creation that she traditionally learned from her mother. She creates handbags using unique fabrics and patterns. During the residency, Somayeh will explore her craft through the unique materials, aesthetics, forms, colors, and motifs in the gardens. 6. ArtsLink NB's Call for Curatorial Work: Arts Atlantic Symposium

Deadline: August 5, 2021

ArtsLink NB is looking for an energetic creative thinker to lead the development of the inaugural Arts Atlantic Symposium (AAS) to be held in Saint John, NB, in the late summer of 2022. The AAS will be a multi-disciplinary arts festival and conference intended to celebrate the diverse work of artists and arts organizations of Atlantic Canada and build working relationships within the industry on the regional and national levels. The AAS will have a unique structure, being both a public festival with live performances, art installations, and public exhibitions, as well as an industry conference with keynote speakers, panels, and networking events.

ArtsLink NB is committed to inclusivity in the development and implementation of the symposium. The curator/curatorial team will be responsible for the concept and framing of the conference and the public art component of the festival. The successful candidate(s) need not be based in Atlantic Canada; however, a connection to the region is vital. This position includes a modest travel budget although we anticipate that much of the research and consultation will take place virtually. The curator will report to the Executive Director and Symposium Committee. Whenever possible the curator will develop and organize material in order that it may be used by organizers in subsequent iterations of the symposium.

This is a part-time contract position, in three phases, with Phases 2 and 3 being contingent on performance and funding. Remuneration for the three phases will be:

- \$8,500 for Phase 1
- \$4,200 for Phase 2
- \$6,100 for Phase 3
