1. Fredericton Arts Alliance Summer Residencies present Karen LeBlanc from Jul. 25-31

Karen LeBlanc will sew fabric hearts next week, as part of her an ongoing project to honour Indigenous children who suffered in Canada's residential schools, with the hope of having hundreds of hearts hanging widely around the city. The hearts, each around 2 x 2.5 inches, will be made of various fabrics – from black with rainbow loops, to orange, to denim.

On July 25, weather permitting, LeBlanc will set up her sewing station in Wilmot Park and will invite passers-by to take one of the hearts. She hopes that they will be hung from trees around Fredericton, as a demonstration of solidarity and remembrance for the Indigenous children lost to residential schools in Canada.

As part of her residency with the Fredericton Arts Alliance, LeBlanc will also be weaving a tapestry. The piece will be made of yarn and will feature a heart in its centre, connecting it thematically to the hanging hearts. She intends to work on the tapestry at home and in different public locations around Fredericton during her residency.

LeBlanc's residency will be shared with the community via the Fredericton Arts Alliance's social media platforms and website. 4. NotaBle Acts Theatre Company to Stage their 20th Summer Theatre Festival, Jul. 22-31

The NotaBle Acts Theatre Company will stage its 2021 Summer Theatre Festival, showcasing new plays by emerging and established New Brunswick playwrights at venues across Fredericton. A year after 2020's festival had to be heavily modified due to the COVID-19 pandemic, this year's festival will see live audiences for all productions and a return to theatre (almost) as normal. Thirteen new plays will be performed over ten days, including one act plays, ten-minute plays, a site-specific play, readings of new works in development, and *81 Minutes*, a main stage production staged in cooperation with the Falling Iguana Theatre Company.

Co-created by Alexa Higgins and Ian Goff, 81 Minutes is a physical theatre, and clown-inspired, comedy/drama that takes the audience on a fast-paced thrill ride through the true story of one of the world's most famous unsolved art thefts, which took place at Boston's Isabella Stewart Gardner Museum in 1990. 81 Minutes will be performed July 22-25 at Theatre New Brunswick's Open Space Theatre.

The twelve other new plays to be performed at the festival were selected as winners in NotaBle Acts' annual province-wide playwriting contest, including *MAD about Van Horne* by Ron Kelly Spurles and *Life Goes On* by Muriel Falkenstein, winners of Acting Out, the 2021 competition's one act category. Acting Out will be performed at Memorial Hall, UNB, nightly from July 29-31.

Taking it to the Streets, the winners of NB Acts' 2021 ten-minute play competition, features four short plays performed outdoors at Officers' Square, including Brandon Hicks' A Reunion of Lovers; McKenna Boeckner's Marionettes; Monika Rennick's Closure; and Madeline Savoie's Graffiti; or, the Dangerous Mind of Avery Klein. These four plays will be performed as an hour of free theatre at 7:30pm on July 26-29, and will be followed nearby by performances of Neomi Iancu Haliva's site-specific play Concrete and Plaster, set in a used clothing store.

The festival line-up will also feature Play Out Loud, readings of five new plays in development, including three runners up in the festival's One Act playwriting competition: *Limbo* by Madeline Savoie, *Ill-Advised Capital* by Sana Hashmat, and *Go Ahead and Make Me the Happiest Woman in the World* by Vy Phan. The readings will be rounded out by the two winners of the 2021 NB Acts Middle and High School playwriting contests: Alex Dawson's *She Sssaid* and Ava Chamberlain's *The Mushroom Prince*. Play Out Loud readings will take place on the afternoons of July 25 and 31 downtown, and at TNB's Open Space Theatre.

Find multidisciplinary artists Anne Stillwell-Leblanc and Kim Stillwell at Killarney Lake Park, and wildlife illustrator Kaitlin Hoyt in the Fredericton Botanic Garden at Odell Park. Anne Stillwell-Leblanc is a multidisciplinary artist who focuses on linoleum block printing. Her influences are rooted in the nature of New Brunswick. Anne's work draws on the simple yet complex composition of nature, creating floral, foliage, insect, and animal designs in striking black and white imagery. Kim Stillwell is a multidisciplinary artist traditionally trained in pottery through the certificate program at the New Brunswick College of Craft and Design. Inspired by the nature of New Brunswick, her work reflects imagery of the flora, fauna, and waterways of the Maritimes.

Kaitlin Hoyt is a wildlife illustrator based in Fredericton. The connection between wellbeing, art, and nature is a cornerstone to Kaitlin's craft as she seeks to pay homage, show gratitude, and better understand the natural world. Having already completed "100 Birds in 100 Days", Kaitlin will continue to be inspired by the diversity of nature by painting all 430 of New Brunswick's bird species. Back to top.

12. Fish Wish in Phoenix Square - Ongoing Temporary Art Installation

A temporary public art installation called *Fish Wish* is now on display in Phoenix Square at Fredericton City Hall, and will remain there until mid-fall. The installation, by Fredericton area artist Jean Hudson, involves 240 recycled aluminum cans, some collected from the banks of the Saint John River. The project was inspired by the large amounts of trash found in rivers and oceans.

Hudson used discarded cans from the banks of the Saint John River and local roadside ditches to create this art piece. She pressed them into the shape of a fish. Each can is washed, the tops and bottoms were removed, imprinted under pressure, and then eyes were hand embossed so each fish is different. The fish shaped cans are then finished with a coloured transparent dye.

The piece of public art was commissioned by the City of Fredericton. It is the second year for such a display outside City Hall. The artist and her partner, Jack, use recycled materials to create large pieces of art that they share on their website www.jhudsonart.ca. Back to top.

Deadline: Sunday, August 15, 2021

The Fredericton Arts Alliance is seeking an individual to act as a Guest Editor of the *ARTSnews* while the primary Editor is out of office in October 2021. Requirements include:

- Must have access to a computer with document editing software (Microsoft Windows is currently used, but other programs such as Google Docs, LibreOffice, Open Office, etc. could be used as well)
- Must be able to edit PDFs and add links using editors such as Adobe Acrobat, PDFescape, etc.
- Some familiarity with Gmail and Mail Chimp would be considered an asset, though these can be taught.
- Will be required to upload the final document using FTP program such as FileZilla.
- Must be available for training with current Editor to understand process and timelines/deadlines during August or September 2021.

The take-over would happen on October 7, 2021 and would conclude once the weekly newsletter has been sent to subscribers on October 21, 2021. The primary editor will then return to her duties. This absence covers the two weeks, and includes issues on October 14 and 21.

This job can be done from home with training occurring either over Zoom or, if preferred, in person with the current editor. In terms of a time-commitment, the time it takes to edit, create, and release the weekly newsletter can vary depending upon the number of notices received, but typically averages 7-10 hours per week.

6. ArtsLink NB's Call for Curational Work: Arts Atlantic Symposium

Deadline: August 5, 2021

ArtsLink NB is looking for an energetic creative thinker to lead the development of the inaugural Arts Atlantic Symposium (AAS) to be held in Saint John, NB, in the late summer of 2022. The AAS will be a multi-disciplinary arts festival and conference intended to celebrate the diverse work of artists and arts organizations of Atlantic Canada and build working relationships within the industry on the regional and national levels. The AAS will have a unique structure, being both a public festival with live performances, art installations, and public exhibitions, as well as an industry conference with keynote speakers, panels, and networking events.

ArtsLink NB is committed to inclusivity in the development and implementation of the symposium. The curator/curatorial team will be responsible for the concept and framing of the conference and the public art component of the festival. The successful candidate(s) need not be based in Atlantic Canada; however, a connection to the region is vital. This position includes a modest travel budget although we anticipate that much of the research and consultation will take place virtually. The curator will report to the Executive Director and Symposium Committee. Whenever possible the curator will develop and organize material in order that it may be used by organizers in subsequent iterations of the symposium.

This is a part-time contract position, in three phases, with Phases 2 and 3 being contingent on performance and funding. Remuneration for the three phases will be:

- \$8,500 for Phase 1
- \$4,200 for Phase 2
- \$6,100 for Phase 3
