1. Fredericton Arts Alliance Summer Residencies present Jean-Michel Cliche from Aug. 22 to 28

Jean-Michel Cliche is writing a new play about Palamedes, King Arthur's only Arabic Knight of the Round Table. He says that it will likely be a one-act play, and may be staged by theatre companies upon its completion. Cliche will explore his own Arabic heritage by researching the stories of Palamedes and his role as a knight. The playwright will also explore the concept of *third culture*: the culture in which an individual lives that is distinct from the two primary cultures of their heritage (for example, Cliche's parents are French and Lebanese, making him a "Third Culture Kid")

The artist will host a free stage fighting workshop, teaching a choreographed fight as well as the basics of safe combat in theatre. The workshop will take place at Odell Park on Saturday, August 21, at 2pm. The fight choreography will be based on a scene from Cliche's play, giving theatre fans an opportunity to engage with the project.

2. City of Fredericton Summer Artist in Residence presents Jason Anderson & Ralph Simpson

Find musician Jason Anderson at Killarney Lake Park and wood fibre artist Ralph Simpson in the Fredericton Botanic Garden. Visitors can see artists in person while abiding by public health guidelines. For daily updates and weekly events, follow the artists' social media linked through our website.

Jason Anderson (August 16 – September 3) is a singer-songwriter who blends imagistic narratives with cathartic and communal performances. Jason writes and records in Fredericton while maintaining a roster of students at the Charlotte Street Arts Centre. During the residency, Jason will create a celebration of nature and community by creating his new album, *Forests, Fredericton*. He will host live streams on every other day for one-song performances and discussions, as well as an outdoor concert of the new five-song EP at the end of the residency.

Ralph Simpson (August 23 – September 3) is a wood fibre artist from rural New Brunswick. Blending his education as a biologist, his work as a Forest Ranger Research Biologist, and his love for nature, Ralph's art creates sculptures of woven flora. Ralph is a life-long learner, having completed his diploma at NBCCD's Wabanaki Visual Arts Program and continuing to learn techniques from around the world. During the residency, Ralph will explore the value of gardens to our ecosystems, creating larger than life seed pods of wildflowers and grasses.

12. Artist to Paint Fredericton's Newest Mural along Valley Trail NBEX Horse Barns

The Fredericton Trails Coalition, in partnership with the New Brunswick Provincial Exhibition (NBEX), has chosen the winning artist to paint the new mural on the NBEX Valley Trail horse barns. Visual artist Mike Burt of Trackside Studios was selected in a two-part design competition to create a mural that would cover the graffiti and tagging along the two NBEX barn walls that run parallel to the city's Valley Trail.

The artist will use stylistic expressionist spray paint techniques to paint a collage of meaningful and colourful images that pay homage to Fredericton's history, landmarks, and traditional and modern cultures. The artist and his crew arrived on August 13 and began the mural on August 14.

The mural will be unveiled at the opening of this year's Fredericton Exhibition on September 6, 2021. Career Development Program - **Deadline: September 1, 2021**

The Career Development program is designed to recognize and encourage arts professionals who have demonstrated exceptional artistic talent and potential, and who are pursuing a career in the arts. The program is divided in four components:

- **The Arts by Invitation** component is for assistance to present work by invitation in established arts events.
- **The Artist in Residence** component is for assistance for participation in residency opportunities of three (3) months and less. The artists in residence are to contribute to the promotion and understanding of the arts by means of the artists' contact with the clientele of the establishments.
- **The Professional Development** component is for assistance for professional development scholarships for studies and mentorships.
- **The Professionalization and Promotion** component is designed to assist artists to produce tools related to the promotion of the artist's work and career with a view to broadening the dissemination network for their work and diversifying their sources for funding.

This challenge puts everyone on a level playing field where no one has any of that fancy, expensive filmmaking stuff. It's just you, your phone and your wild creative spirit.

Who can enter? All residents of NB of any age can participate, and it is free to enter. Is there a big red carpet event? No, but there is a \$100 prize for the best film as selected by our panel of judges. How does this work?

- Step 1: Put together a team of 1-3 NB residents.
- Step 2: **Register until September 20, 2021 at** <https://www.kenlarproductions.com/home#h.mtjpmwcl7kqe>
- Step 3: On Thursday September 23 at 6pm you will receive an inspiration package from which to create your film and the 72 hour countdown begins.
- Step 4: Write your script. Shoot it. Edit it. Upload it by Sunday, September 26 at 6pm.

Official Rules:

1. Participants must follow the Government of New Brunswick COVID guidelines.
2. All films must be family friendly. The judges reserve the right to disqualify submissions that include graphic violence or language, discrimination or phobia against a person or group, explicit sexuality, etc.
3. Only cell phones or tablets can be used to record video or sound. No other recording devices are permitted and this includes drones and other cameras such as DSLR, mirrorless, point-and-shoot, or GoPro/action.
4. Any software or app can be used to record video or sound on the cell phone or tablet. This includes Zoom, MS Teams and other web-conferencing software.
5. Do not use stock footage or images.
6. Do not use copyrighted music unless you have a license or permission to do so.
7. Organizers and judges of the competition are prohibited from participating in it.
8. Submissions will be scored by each judge on a scale of 1-5 stars (5 being best) in each of these categories:
 - a. Use of inspiration package
 - b. Story/Script
 - c. Acting
 - d. Directing
 - e. Cinematography
 - f. Sound
 - g. Editing / Effects
