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1. Three Exhibitions on Display at Gallery 78 from now until Sept. 4

Gallery 78 continues its summer programming with three new exhibitions featuring work by Bruno Bobak, William Forrestall, Steven Rhude, and many more:

- **Close to Home** (works by Bruno Bobak, William Forrestall, Glenn Hall, Jack Humphrey, Stephen Hutchings, Jonathan MacDonald, Stephen May, David McKay, Richard Montpetit, Daniel Porter, Steven Rhude, & James Wilson): As years go by, there is a reassurance and familiarity in the change of seasons: tree buds will bloom every spring, flowers will flourish in summer, the leaves will turn in the fall, and winter will coat the landscape in snow. In this exhibition series from Gallery 78, art lovers can enjoy a collection of work depicting the beauty, ruggedness, and mystery of Atlantic Canada throughout the year.
- **Figures: From Olympia to the Miramichi:** Figurative pieces have always intrigued and endeared us. One can peer into the world of another, and not just the artist's, but that of the person depicted in the art piece. Who are they? What are they doing? How do they feel on any given day? In this exhibition of portraits and figurative works, let yourself be inspired by the soft shapes and delightful textures of the various mediums featured.
- **New Work:** Enjoy drawings by Jessie Babin, busts by Karen Knight and Dory Cliff (*The Link*), the latest piece in Steven Rhude's longstanding series of boats placed in landscapes. Jewellery by Kathryn Cronin and paintings by Stephen May round out some of the latest works on display in this latest exhibition.

5. UNB Art Centre opens *Vita Plume: Patterns & Portraits* on Sept. 10 at 5 p.m. until Oct. 29

The UNB Art Centre opens its doors and welcomes back the community to in-person exhibits and programs with the first exhibition of 2021, *Vita Plume: Patterns & Portraits* which opens. *Patterns & Portraits* features several bodies of work produced over 3 decades by master weaver Vita Plume. Working with a digital Jacquard loom, pieces are woven then dyed using a technique known as *Shibori*, an ancient Japanese method for hand-dyeing fabric.

The West Gallery will present the penetrating series *Fallen Soldiers, USA/Canada* (2010). In the exhibition catalogue *Commemorations* produced by the New Brunswick Museum exhibition in 2019, curator Peter Larocque observes that this work “bear silent witness...to the devastating realities of war.” The East Gallery will commemorate the special relationship of women to craft. Featured will be weavings from the *Alice Lusk Webster Suite*, based on a portrait of one of the New Brunswick Museum’s early champions, the *Doris Ullman Project* which portrays textile workers of the Appalachian region of Kentucky along with earlier work honouring the artist’s Latvian roots.

Plume’s portraits of faces and hands created using subtle shifts of light and colour tell the story of forgotten makers who devoted their lives to the art of weaving and textiles. Born in Montreal of Latvian refugees, Vita Plume has a Master of Fine Art from NSCAD University in Halifax. She has taught at the New Brunswick College of Craft and Design in Fredericton, NSCAD, Concordia University, Montreal and the University of North Carolina in Raleigh.

8. Performing Arts Scholarship Recipient Announced

Madeline Savoie is a playwright, actor, musician, and recent graduate of École Sainte Anne. Her plays have been featured in the Notable Acts Theatre Festival (*Out of Water, Graffiti, Limbo*) and the Plain Site Theatre Festival (*Out of Water*). She has acted with several local theatre groups including Theatre New Brunswick (*Beauty and the Beast, The Wizard of Oz*), the Calithumpians, Impulse Productions (*Matilda*), and St. Thomas University's Propel Festival (*Knock*). Madeline will be attending Concordia University in the fall and will be pursuing a BFA with a specialization in Performance Creation.

Council of the Arts Fredericton presented quality performances to Fredericton audiences from 1978 until 2006 through its ONSTAGE and KIDSTAGE programs, and encouraged young people in their study of the performing arts through awards and scholarships. The Performing Arts Scholarship was created in June 2007 and has been managed through a designated fund agreement with the Fredericton Community Foundation. Since 2007, fifteen students from a variety of disciplines including acting, music, vocal performance and sound recording have been awarded the scholarship. 2021 is the final year the Council of the Arts Fredericton Scholarship will be awarded. The Board of Directors of the Fredericton Playhouse is pleased to name Don Bossé as the 2021 recipient of the Playhouse Honours. Don is an engaged, active musician with an impressive record of service in New Brunswick. For over 35 years he taught music in public schools, beginning at the elementary school level, and eventually reinvigorating the music program as head of the Fine Arts Department at Fredericton High School over a period of 2 decades. He currently lectures in the Faculty of Fine Arts and the School of Education at St. Thomas University, and has been the founder and director of the St. Thomas University Jazz Ensemble for the past 26 years.

In consultation with the Office of First Nations Education, Bossé has recently completed a Grade 9 to 12 Indigenous Music Resource guide and is currently working on a Middle School Indigenous Music guide. He is an active musician with several jazz groups in the region, while continuing to work as a clinician, adjudicator, conductor, and lecturer, promoting jazz music and championing methods in early childhood development as well as secondary and post-secondary music education.

Established in 2008, the Playhouse Honours recognizes an individual's involvement in the performing arts in Fredericton, fostering a deeper appreciation of the value that people can bring to community life through their work in music, theatre, dance, spoken-word, and multidisciplinary performing arts. 3. Only cell phones or tablets can be used to record video or sound. No other recording devices are permitted and this includes drones and other cameras such as DSLR, mirrorless, point-and-shoot, or GoPro/action.
4. Any software or app can be used to record video or sound on the cell phone or tablet. This includes Zoom, MS Teams and other web-conferencing software.
5. Do not use stock footage or images.
6. Do not use copyrighted music unless you have a license or permission to do so.
7. Organizers and judges of the competition are prohibited from participating in it.
8. Submissions will be scored by each judge on a scale of 1-5 stars (5 being best) in each of these categories:
 - a. Use of inspiration package
 - b. Story/Script
 - c. Acting
 - d. Directing
 - e. Cinematography
 - f. Sound
 - g. Editing / Effects
