15. Strathbutler Award 2021

Since 1991, the Sheila Hugh Mackay Foundation has presented the [Strathbutler Award](#) to honour New Brunswick artists who have achieved personal excellence in any discipline of visual arts, while having had a distinctive impact on the cultural life of our province. Based on the unanimous recommendation of a professional, independent jury, interdisciplinary artist, [Mathieu Léger](#) is the 2021 recipient of the Strathbutler Award.

The jury characterized Léger as an internationally recognized conceptualist and minimalist, whose performances and interactions with his many and diverse audiences invite viewers to a deeper understanding of personal and collective identity. He mines history, science, and poetics to chart an informed and contemporary response to life's journeys. Léger has demonstrated leadership through decades of work with IMAGO, l'Association des groupes en arts visuels francophones (AGAVF), Galerie Sans Nom, CARFAC Maritimes and the New Brunswick Department of Tourism, Heritage and Culture. The vast scope of his ambulatory art practice coupled with his commitment to engaging New Brunswick audiences in performance art has made a significant contribution to the cultural ecosystem of the province.

The Department of Tourism, Heritage and Culture invites nominations or applications from arts and cultural professionals in New Brunswick and elsewhere to serve as jurors to evaluate applications for the *2022-25 Core Funding Program*. The Department takes an inclusive approach to the juror selection process and would like to especially encourage applications from BIPOC, newcomer, LGBTQ2IA+, and diverse arts professionals.

The Core Funding Program supports New Brunswick non-profit organizations in the following categories:

- **A Component:** Medium & Large Production/Presentation and Arts Service Organizations
- **B Component:** Small Production/Presentation and Arts Service Organizations
- **C Component:** Community Cultural Centres

Juries decide which applicants should receive grants; they also recommend the amount of each grant. The Department selects jurors based on a balanced representation of regional and cultural diversity, New Brunswick's two official languages, and the mix of arts disciplines represented by the applications submitted to the program. Preference will be given to jurors with prior jury experience.
