Set during the holiday season, the play also draws a great deal of humour from an unlikely source – a Christmas tree - not yet an established part of English holiday traditions. *Miss Bennet: Christmas at Pemberley* will receive four performances at the Fredericton Playhouse between December 9 and 11.
